When we first met her, she was a shy toddler all of three years old. What a difference ten years can make! **Bria Nicole Shaw** is a confident teen of thirteen years. She is in the eighth grade at Barrett Traditional

Middle School.

Bria likes her school; however, she says that some of the school's policies are a bit strict, for instance, the uniform policy and the principle's restriction on some field trips. She is an active member of both the chorus and dance team at Barrett. In the chorus she sings alto and loves the competition that the chorus attends. Recently the chorus was in competition and they achieved the "Distinguished" award. The chorus is also planning to go to Gatlinburg, Tennessee soon.

Dance is Bria's passion. In the last two years, she and her parents have traveled to Florida for dance competitions. Last year Barrett won first place and this year they came in second place. She enjoys going to dance practice and looks forward to the summer dance camp.

Bria will begin high school this fall. She has tried out at the Youth Performing Arts School (YPAS) and expects to receive her acceptance letter during spring break. YPAS is her mom's choice. But Bria's choice is Male Traditional. She gave some good reasons for wanting to attend Male. First, it is the school where all of her friends are going. Second, it is the school that her grandmother was the first black to graduate from Male. Third, Male has a uniform policy and YPAS does not. "I do want to wear uniforms. I would be late to the bus every morning, trying to find something to wear. I wear uniforms now and I am always late."

Bria plans to attend a Performing Arts College. She wants to dance more. "I want to go out of state. I just don't want to stay home. I want to get away. My daddy wants me to get away, too. Jokingly he said, 'you are not allowed go to college here'."

She enjoys music. And of course, we all know that she and her family are avid moviegoers. Her favorite movie of all times is "Parent Trap" starring the young Lindsay Lohan. She knows all the words in the movie. The star was only twelve and Bria found it amazing that the young actress played two different characters (twins) so well.

When asked what she wanted her Pleasant View family to know, she said, "That I love them so much and seeing them for almost eleven years now and I thank them for that. I just really love them. I have grown in so many ways here. I would not choose any other church."

When asked what was her favorite gospel song she just started to laugh. Then she explained. When the family was attending a revival in Virginia, a lady had sung *I Got a Testimony*. "It wasn't the words, but it was how she was moving as she sung the words **When I look back over my life**. I laugh every time I hear that song. My mom and I would look at each other and say that's our song. It is just amazing how I remembered this because it was so long ago. I was little and my thought was, 'that is not how you sing that song'."

Her favorite scripture is John 3:16 – "it is the first scripture that always comes to my mind."

Bria loves to read. Her favorite book is Dave Pelzer's *A Child Called It*, a true story about a young boy's mental and physical abuses carried out by his mother. It is a story that touched her deeply. She recommends the book to everyone.

Not only is Bria a compassionate person, she is also very athletic. She would love to learn how to play soccer or tennis. Last year in the seventh grade she did track and her team came in first for the long jump and the relay; and she came in second place in the four hundred meter dash. Track for her is a family affair - her dad, mom and brothers all had participated in track.

Bria thank you for sharing with us and we are proud to have you as a part of our family.

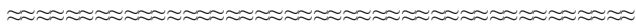

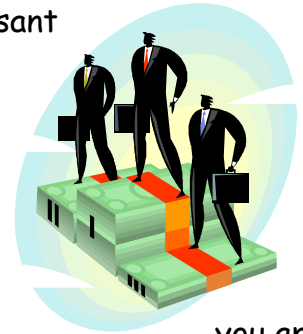

But you stuck around and that makes us glad.

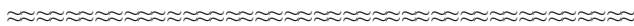
We share 10 years of wonderful memories here,

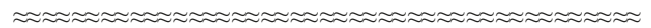

3. Photographs should be clear with plain backgrounds. Glossy prints are preferred. The size of the photograph is not as important as the quality. Identify all persons shown in your photograph and give pertinent information. Even snapshots may be printed in the newsletter if they are sharp and distinct. All photos will be returned to you.
